

Take an economy beef cut and turn it into a superb main dish this week with our SWISS SKILLET DINNER recipe! For 7-8 portions begin with 2 full-cut Chuck steaks, cut about 1 1/2 inches thick. Mix together 1/2 cup all-purpose flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon cup all-purpose flour, 1 teaspoon fresh chopped parsley, dredge the steaks in the flour mixture, shaking off any excess that remains. Heat 4 tablespoons shortening in a large skillet and quickly brown the steaks in the hot fat, turning once. Remove the meat after browning and add to the skillet 1 large chopped onion, 4 large sprigs chopped parsley, and 1/2 teaspoon crushed oregano. When the onions turn golden brown add and cook just 3 minutes, 1/2 cup water, 4 tablespoons catsup, 2 bay leaves and 1 1/2 teaspoons salt. Now add to the mixture 1 cup cooking sherry, 1 small can sliced mushrooms with liquid and the browned steaks. Cover and simmer over low heat for 2 hours until the meat is fork-tender. Check occasionally to see if a bit more liquid is needed, and if so add a little more sherry or water. Add and cook just 10 minutes 3 small packages frozen peas. Transfer meat and gravy to a hot platter and sprinkle with 4 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese. Garnish with fresh parsley sprigs and serve at once with brown rice or mashed potato, a mixed salad and warm cherry cobbler!
