

Adventists to Send Pastor To Quadrennial Conference

The Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists today announced that Pastor Manson Metcalf of Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, has been appointed as a delegate to the 11th quadrennial Constituency Meeting of the Pacific Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists being held in Long Beach, Feb. 3 to 7.

Announcement of Pastor Metcalf's appointment was made by Cree Sandefur, Glendale, Southland president of Adventists. Pastor Metcalf will be one of 76 official delegates of the Adventist's Southern California Conference to the five-day western states church session.

Some 360 official delegates representing 80,000 Adventist church members in California, Arizona, Utah, Nevada, and Hawaii will attend the session.

PASTOR METCALF'S duties at the session will include serving on various committees charged with selecting top western states leaders of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and voting on all officials of the church's Pacific Union Conference for the next four-year period.

The local minister will also attend sessions of the conference at which reports of every area of activity of the western

states organization will be reported upon.

HOME MISSIONS officers of the Torrance church will attend a 1963 plans conference in Glendale on Saturday. Louie Miller, 20852 Halldale Ave., home missions director of the local church, said he will be accompanied to the meet by assistants George Griese, 5853 Flambeau, Palos Verdes Estates, and Floyd Stark, 5708 Clearsite St.

"This conference will aid in planning for increased home missions activity in Torrance," said Miller. "Included in plans of the session will be ways in which the local Adventist church may expand its services to underprivileged and otherwise needy persons in the Torrance area," explained Miller.

ACCORDING to the church home missions official, more than 300 home missions representatives of the 84 Seventh-day Adventist churches in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, Ventura and Kern counties will attend the plans conference.

Other plans and discussions of the session, noted Miller, will include lay church member evangelism in the church, community visitation programs, and how laymen may more effectively encourage Bible study among their friends.

Mrs. Geraldine Karpel, member of the El Camino College physics faculty, will be on leave for the spring semester, during which time she will attend the annual meeting of the American Assn. of Physics Teachers in New York City.

Mrs. Karpel's position at the college will be taken by Julius Summer Miller, physics instructor, who has been on a round-the-world tour, while on sabbatical leave from El Camino during the fall semester.

Miller toured the British Isles, throughout the continent of Europe, the Middle East, Australia, and New Zealand.

He highlighted his tour with visits to places of historical scientific interest connected with such scientific greats as Newton and Galileo. He also gave lectures and demonstration experiments in the teaching of physics, a topic from which he has drawn international fame.
