Tartars Out of Loop Chase

Proving an earlier victory over Torrance was no fluke, Beverly Hills knocked the Tartars out of the Pioneer League basketball race on Tuesday with a crushing 47-42 victory.

Overcoming a third period Torrance lead and withstanding a late surge by the home five, Beverly limited the league's leading scorer, Lynn Archibald, to eight points in taking the win.

Averaging over 20 points a contest, Archibald was saddled with four fouls by halftime and did not even play in the third quarter.

WARREN Tetley got hot for the visitors and Beverly soon held a 39-32 lead.

CLAYTON hit two free throws, Archibald scored two points on a tip-in then hit on a jump shot from the corner, and Clayton stole the ball at mid court and dunked it as TBS came back to assume a 40-39 lead.

Barry Fay hit a short shot for Beverly and the Normans held a 41-40 lead with one minute left. Archibald connected again and Torrance was back ahead.

ALAN FAY put the Normans back into the lead with 40 seconds left with a two pointer. Barry Fay then missed a one and one free throw situation and Archibald grabbed the rebound as Torrance called time.

With seconds left, Randy Hester missed a long set shot as Archibald fouled out on the play. Alan Fay hit two free throws to ice the game and his brother Barry then followed with a lay-up as the final horn sounded.

ALAN FAY wound up with 14 points while Barry canned 13 markers, six coming in the final period. Tetley hit five of his seven digits in the last stanza for Beverly.

For Torrance, Ernie Clayton canned 12 points and center Steve Waters added 11 more. Archibald, ice-cold the first half, dropped in six points in the final period.

FOUR KNIGHTS connected in double figures to almost pace BMHS to the upset.


THROUGHOUT the first half, the fray was skin-tight with the score knotted at 10-10 after the first stanza and Beverly holding only a two-point bulge at intermission.



Bay Loop Fives Open 2nd Round

Opening the second round of the Bay League basketball season tomorrow night, North High will host Mira Costa while South High will be the guest of weak Santa Monica.

Both games begin at 8 p.m. North will face a rugged task in attempting to rebound from two consecutive losses. The Saxons have been dumped by Inglewood and Morning-side, and appear an unlikely winner against Micohi, who has lost only to undefeated Hawthorne.

Santa Monica will be headed by Mike Bryant, who delivered 23 and 25-point efforts last week to hike his average to 14.33.
