Resident Gets New Position

Booklet Outlines Care For Respiratory Ills

A new booklet, intended as a guide and reference for all those who provide direct nursing care for people afflicted with chronic respiratory diseases, is now in print and available free to both professional people and laymen through the Christmas Seal Assn. Prepared by the volunteer nursing education committee of the Tuberculosis and Health Assn. of Los Angeles County, the new booklet is titled "Nursing Care of the Patient with Chronic Respiratory Illness." The publication is designed to assist nurses and members of families caring for persons with respiratory disease.

MEMBERS OF the committee which prepared the booklet are: Miss J. Marion Stewart, R.N., director of nursing, Kaiser Foundation Hospital, Harbor City; Mrs. Rachel Richter, director of nursing services, Vernon City Health Dept.; Dr. Eleanor Drummond, education director, UCLA School of Nursing; and Dr. A. Lloyd Andersen of the TB and Health Assn. The booklet treats in brief the symptoms, general care and emergency treatment for seven chronic respiratory diseases: bronchial asthma, bronchiectasis, bronchitis, coccidioidomycosis, emphysema, pneumoconiosis and tuberculosis.
