CHP Warns Of Changing Turn Signals

Conversion of turn signals from white to amber on pre-1963 model automobiles is a violation of the vehicle code.

The warning has been issued by the California Highway Patrol which says the vehicle code section provides that no device which modifies the original design or performance of any lighting equipment may be installed unless first approved by the CHP.

"No modifications of turn signals on 1962 or earlier model cars have been approved, with a few minor exceptions. Information on these may be obtained from any local CHP office."

Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden said that the appearance of amber turn signals as a stock item on 1963 model cars has prompted some owners of earlier models to undertake conversions to amber.

"Illegal modifications which patrol officers have observed include insertion of unapproved bulbs or lenses, and use of bulb covers, lens filters, lens dyes or sprays, none of which is approved, the commissioner said."
