

Internal Revenue Pamphlet Gives Tax Deduction Info

R. A. Riddell director of the Los Angeles Internal Revenue District, announced issuance of a new, comprehensive pamphlet which explains how taxpayers may deduct business travel, entertainment and gift

expenses on their 1962 returns. A special feature of the pamphlet is an explanation of the new rules which will apply after Dec. 31, 1962, with emphasis on the stricter rules for current recordkeeping and substantiation of these expenses required by the Revenue Act of 1962. Illustrative examples and questions and answers on the new rules are also included in the booklet.

THE PUBLICATION covers such items as what constitutes travel away from home, when meals and lodging are deductible, laundry expenses, tips, and automobile expenses. Also discussed are club

dues, other entertainment facilities, and reimbursement and allowance arrangements.

The booklet was written for salesmen and other employees; employers, such as corporations, partnerships and sole proprietors; and independent contractors such as professional men.

THE BOOKLET is free and may be obtained in person, or by calling MA 5-8999 or writing the Internal Revenue office in Los Angeles. Ask for "Travel, Entertainment, and Gift Expenses," Document No. 5049.

Taxpayers outside of the Los Angeles area may obtain it from their local Internal Revenue Service office.

Bulk quantities of the pamphlet are available at no charge to corporations and other business organizations for distribution to employees or members.
