Porpoise Room Greets Beal-Streeters Again

Pete Bealman, one of the all-time great trombone players, and his "Beal-Streeters" have opened in a return engagement at Marineland Restaurant in Palos Verdes, unwinding listenable Dixieland music in the "Porpoise Room."

The rhythmic six-piece band is signed by George M. Foster, owner of Marineland Restaurant, for the next five weeks to play four shows nightly except Mondays for the cocktail-dinner crowd.

BEHIND THE sonorous harmony of Bealman's shining horn are the fluid and inventive patterns of his Dixieland instrumentalists. Their repertoire is clean and clear, nice 'n'

easy, not blasts of melodic rockets, but pure jazz threading the arrangements of each tune with controlled sonority.

After years of performing with other top-name groups in New Orleans, Chicago and other shrines of Dixieland music, Bealman is now enjoying a remarkably swift ascent with his own band.

The "Beal-Streeters" were exceptionally good crowd-pleasers some months ago when they were ushered into the "Porpoise Room" for their initial appearance. Response to their infectious music at this week's opening presages more foot-tapping enjoyment during their current Marineland Restaurant engagement.

New Menthol Cigarette Due in Area
