Three El Camino grapplers captured individual state junior college wrestling championships last weekend to push the Warriors into the second place spot in California.

San Bernardino, the always-powerful representative from the South Central Conference and second place finisher in 1962, entered 10 men in the championships and captured top honors with 79 points.

El Camino finished in the number two slot with 60 points followed by San Mateo with 58.

Economy Run Gives Birth To Changes

Practical and money-saving improvements for the 1964 passenger cars will be traced to this year's Mobil Economy Run, predicted A. C. Pillsbury, chief steward of the competition that will start March 30.

He stated these changes will be developed from the performance of the 36 cars entered in the Detroit-bound road test — or lack of it.

"As a result of the on-the-road testing in our run, certain cars are going to higher gear ratios. The higher ratios give better gasoline economy without decreasing the cars' ability to accelerate in traffic.

"WE BET that a few carburetors will be redesigned to permit leaner air-fuel mixtures for more miles to the gallon following the run. Even some camshafts will be redesigned to permit more economical valve timing," he said.

Pillsbury stated that a year ago a manufacturer developed a thrifty carburetor for a model entered in the run.

THE CAR WON its class, and the carburetor has continued as standard equipment — an added benefit to buyers of the model.

What's in store for 1965 and after? He believes that a big development will be lighter weight cars. Lighter metals and light but strong plastics will be a major contribution to both economy and efficiency for American cars, he said.
