## Board Candidate Tells Aims for City Schools

A more practical education, specifically tailored to meet the individual needs of each student, is the aim of the recently formed Torrance Interested Citizen's Committee for John McClure, M.D.

McClure's candidacy for Torrance Board of Education was announced by Donald Pennington, selected as chairman for the group, at their organizational breakfast meeting recently.

"We have a fine candidate in Dr. McClure," said Pennington. "He has no axe to grind. He's simply, but keenly, interested in children and their education."

**OTHER OFFICERS** chosen by the committee are Mrs. Peg Bailey, secretary, and Robert Rector, treasurer.

Introduced by the chairman, Dr. McClure outlined his aims for assuring educational rights for the child enrolled in Torrance schools. He emphasized that parents are not getting their tax money's worth in a situation where practices of overcrowding, unnecessary expenditures, and disregarding the individual needs of the student are accepted.

"A child's right to the best in public education is part of his heritage as an American. In Torrance, we are depriving our children of this rightful education by allowing our school system to be directed by those more interested in personal gain than in the children themselves," said Dr. McClure.
