## Harbor Council Slates Youth Forum March 23

The Harbor Area Welfare Planning Council, in cooperation with Los Angeles Harbor College and local service clubs, will sponsor a Youth Forum Saturday from 3:45 to 7 p.m., at Harbor College.

The primary purpose of the Youth Forum is to give youth an opportunity to participate in the solution of community problems involving or affecting young adults and to give adult community leaders an opportunity to hear first-hand the opinions and suggestions of thoughtful young people regarding community issues and problems.

EACH OF approximately 10 discussion groups will be composed of Harbor College student body leader as group

chairman, 10 to 15 students from public and private high schools in the Southwest area, and two to four adults observers.

Topics to be discussed regarding youth and the community include: conformity, restrictions, youth services and human relations.

During the dinner session, high school representatives will report conclusions from discussion groups. Summarization will be presented by Dr. Louis Kaplan, assistant superintendent, Torrance Unified School District.

STUDENT participants will be guests of local service clubs at the dinner. Charge for adult observers will be \$2.50 each.

## Kites and Moose Antlers Not Bacon and Eggs Combo

"Don't fly kites over moose antlers." is one bit of advice offered by Bullwinkle and Rocky, popular television cartoon characters who have joined Reddy Kilowatt this year in telling youngsters the proper kite safety rules.

The TV stars and Reddy offer lots of advice and kite-building tips for young enthusiasts in a free booklet now being distributed throughout southern and central California by Southern California Edison Co.

More than half a million copies of "Rocky and Bullwinkle Kite Fun Book" are being given to children in schools and communities served by the electric company, L. E. Jenkins, Edison district manager, said today.

In an entertaining, comic-book fashion, Rocky directs Bullwinkle around the obstacles to proper kite flying and shows how to build a variety of kites in all shapes and sizes.

The one unforeseen problem which Rocky overlooks is Bullwinkle's antlers, leading to the booklet's humorous conclusion.

SUGGESTIONS offered by Rocky include building the kite of wood and paper, not with tinsel, wire or metal. He also points out that kites should be flown in open fields, away from roads, from telephone and power lines and television and radio antennas.

Kids are urged not to fly their kites in wet weather, and if they are snagged on a wire or utility pole, to let go of the string immediately and not try to pull the kite down.
