

Board Okays Improvements On 12 Roads

Portions of 12 county road in the Carson area will be improved and resurfaced under a \$7,200 allocation approved by the Board of Supervisors. A total of 232,360 square feet of new pavement will be spread as part of the County Road Department's program to maintain major roads at peak operational efficiency. Roads effected include Broadwell and Doble avenues from 228th to Belson streets, Doble Avenue from 226th to 227th streets west of Doble Avenue, and 225th Street from Kinard Avenue to Main Street. Also included are Berendo and Petroleum avenues from 228th to 231st streets, Meyler Avenue from 229th to 231st streets, 229th Street from Meyler to Berendo avenues, Belson Street from Petroleum to Vermont avenues, and Gastine Street east to Belson.
