

**College Offers Survey Class In Electronics**

An electronics survey course is scheduled for the fall semester at Harbor College. George Rainey, chairman of the Applied Technology Division, has announced. The course is planned for individuals who need to have knowledge of basic electronic theory in their work or foresee a future need for basic electronic knowledge. Basic electronic theory, materials, tools, processes and testing equipment will be covered. The course is a non-mathematical survey of electronic procedures for building, testing and maintaining electrical and electronic equipment. Robert Starks, supervisor of plant services and foreman in charge of radio, microwave, teletype and carrier systems for Pacific Telephone, will instruct.

**Slides Show Mercy Ship In Wilderness**

Medical work from the hospital ship "Hope" while deep in the wilds of Peru was the subject of slides shown by Dr. Margaret Storkan at a recent Torrance Great Books Discussion Group meeting. The slides were taken by Dr. Storkan while she was a volunteer physician with the ship which visited Peru in 1962-63. They displayed the variety of scenery in Peru, the life and customs of the inhabitants and some of the ancient Inca structures.

Other slides showed the work done by the doctors and staff of the "Hope" on board the ship and in the hospitals and clinics of the host country.

**HC Offers Three New Programs**

College level courses in adding machines, calculating machines, and bookkeeping machines will be offered during the fall semester in Harbor College's new Business Building. The introduction to Office Machines classes will cover instruction in the operation of the full-key board and ten-key type adding machines, and rotary calculating machines. Addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division are presented. Special emphasis will be placed on speed and accuracy. Harbor will also offer three different calculating machines courses — rotary calculators, key-driven calculators, and printing calculators. These courses will teach the application of the fundamentals of addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and related arithmetical problems to mechanical calculating devices is stressed. Special emphasis is placed on good techniques and business standards for speed and accuracy. The bookkeeping machines course, Office Machines 15, develops the application of bookkeeping principles to mechanical devices. The course will also emphasize speed and accuracy. All of the above courses will be taught on new machines. Applications for admission for this semester are being accepted now at the Admissions Office of the College. All persons planning to attend the Fall Semester must apply before Sept. 6.
