## Hahn Hopeful About Convention, Trade Center Near Sports Arena

Establishment of the world's largest Convention and Trade Center in Exposition Park — at no cost to the taxpayer — was virtually assured this week, Supervisor Hahn announced.

Hahn, chairman of a special Coliseum Commission committee planning the project, said the Center would be built on State land with approximately \$6 million worth of revenue bonds, which would be self-retiring from rent and gate receipts.

Although contracts are prepared for firms to conduct legal and economical studies on the project, Hahn moved for a 30-day continuance prior to signing the papers.

**HIS MOTION** was seconded by Councilwoman Rosalind Wyman and vigorously supported by C. S. Smith, a Coliseum Commissioner.

Within the 30 day period, Hahn explained, a meeting will be held between the Coliseum Commission, Mayor of Los Angeles, downtown interests, and state officials to insure united, whole-hearted support for the project.

Working closely with Hahn in developing the Convention Center is George Kinsey, vice president of the California Museum of Science and Industry Board of Directors.

**THE STATE** agency holds title to the Exposition Park land.

Hahn points out that although other sites are being considered for the Convention and Trade Center near the Civic Center, the cost of acquiring land and construction could cost the taxpayers as much as \$25 million for these sites.

As Smith put it: "Who's going to pay for a \$25 million hall. The taxpayers sure won't go for it."

"No taxpayers' money would be required to build the Cen-

ter on State land in Exposition Park, since it would be built with revenue bonds which would be self-retiring," he said.

**REVENUE BONDS** were used to construct the \$7.8 million Sports Arena at no cost to the taxpayers — a venture that has proved highly successful.

It is estimated that the Los

Angeles area is losing a potential \$500,000 a month in business revenue because there is no adequate convention and trade center here to accommodate large shows and exhibits, Hahn said.

The Exhibition Center in Exposition Park could be used in conjunction with the Sports Arena. It would be built underground with parking provided at ground level.
