





Flower Shop Grand Opening Scheduled to Begin Tuesday

Fresh and artificial floral arrangements are among the many features of a new flower shop established by two Torrance women.

Grand opening of The Girls at 1926 S. Pacific Coast Hwy., in the Sea Breeze Shopping Center just east of Tullita Avenue, will be observed Tuesday through Friday.

Co-owners in the venture are Mrs. Mary Ann Hastlet and Mrs. Jeannette Altermatt, both Torrance residents. The shop will be open Tuesdays through Sundays from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. except on holidays when it will remain open later in the evenings.

THE TWO women opened a small gift shop at 201 Ave. I in Redondo Beach in November of 1961 and people often referred to them as "The Girls," hence the name of their new shop.

Gift wrapping, packaging for mailing, daily delivery to hospitals and mortuaries, flowers for weddings, banquets, centerpieces and dignified funeral tributes are among The Girls services.

Mrs. Altermatt was one of four designers on the city of Glendale entry to the Pasadena Rose Parade in 1941. The Glendale float won the sweepstakes trophy that year.

In addition to their floral offerings, The Girls also pro-

vides an advertising service on the printing of letterheads, business cards, statement inserts and brochures.

A UNIQUE service to Torrance and surrounding areas is an executive buying service provided by The Girls. Under this system, The Girls keeps files for businessmen on their wives birthday, anniversary and other occasions. When a particular occasion nears the shop calls the businessman at his place of business and reminds him. If he wishes, the shop will buy the gift and gift wrap it for the busy executive.

"In addition to the dates, we also have to keep on file such information as the wife's size, taste, coloring and other facts in order to purchase the proper gift," Mrs. Hastlet said.
