





Local Realtors Registering for State Convention

Kenneth Peters, president of the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors, announced that plans are now complete for the 59th annual convention of the California Real Estate Assn., according to information he has received from L. H. Wilson of Fresno, president of the 40,000-member association. The convention will be held at the Biltmore Hotel in Los Angeles Sept. 22-26. The Los Angeles Realty Board will be host for the five-day meeting.

Peters said the Gov. Edmund G. Brown, Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, and Ronald Reagan will address general sessions of the convention. Governor Brown is scheduled to sound the keynote Tuesday, Sept. 24, when he speaks on "California Must Lead the Nation."

DR. NORMAN Vincent Peale, noted minister, lecturer and author will speak on Wednesday on the subject, "Why Positive Thinkers Get Positive Results," Peters said. Dr. Peale is pastor of Marble College Church in New York City. His "Power of Positive Thinking" is one of the best-selling non-fiction books of recent times.

Ronald Reagan, star of motion pictures and television and a gifted speaker will address the group on Thursday, Sept. 26. Other notables on the program are Ivy Priest Stevens, former treasurer of the United States, and Dr. Royal L. Garff, professor of speech and marketing at the University of Utah.

Over 4,500 realtors, real estate associates and their guests are expected to attend from 171 real estate boards throughout the state.

TORRANCE CREA directors and committee chairmen are planning to attend the convention, Peters said. Reservations have already been received from Alvin Grancell, Hank Mahler, Kenneth Peters, Jack Schmidt, Del Vaughan, Don Mario, Joseph Mongini, and Lawrence Poeske. Committee chairmen attending will be George Hanback, educational; Harold Lippard, multiple listing; Hank Mahler and Donald Shaw, ethics; Geneva Meara, public affairs; Roy Shaw, legislation; Mary Toombs, realtor public relations.

Many of the realtors are planning to arrive in Los Angeles on Saturday, a day ahead of the convention, to attend a special all-day conference on

real estate education. The conference is co-sponsored by CREA and the State Division of Real Estate.

THE REALTORS will meet with real estate educators from University of California, University of California extension, University of Southern California, state colleges junior colleges, and city schools. They will review and study the real estate education courses offered throughout the state. Burt Smit of Bellflower, chairman of the CREA education committee, will preside.

The luncheon speaker will be Dr. Glenn Dumke, chancellor, the California state colleges. Other featured speakers will be Milton G. Gordon, California real estate commissioner; Walter J. Miller, assistant commissioner, education and publications, Division of Real Estate; Dr. James Gillies, assistant dean, Graduate School of Business Administration, UCLA; John H. Denton, state-wide coordinator, extension division, University of California at Berkeley; McKee Fisk, head of division of business, Fresno State College; Fran McCreary, supervisor, distributive education, Pasadena City Schools, and Dr. A. T. Polin, director, research institute of business and economics, USC.

According to C. Larry Hoag, convention chairman, advance registrations indicate a record turnout for the convention.
