Two Top Polo Aces Decide on El Camino

Two of the state's most sought-after prep water polo players—Ken Benfield and Bill Corcoran of El Segundo High—are expected to carry the load when El Camino College opens its 1963 season Sept. 27 against Pierce College. Benfield, who won All-CIF honorable mention, and Corcoran, a second-team selection, are both labeled exceptional prospects by Warrior coach Rudy Kroon.

The two newcomers will team with veteran Cappy Sheeley and freshman Jim Westerman to form a potentially strong front line scoring combination.

Stock Cars Back For CJA Races

Returning to the Los Angeles area after an extended absence, the late model stock cars will bid for a \$2,000 purse this afternoon in a California Jalopy Assn. race at Ascot Park in Gardena.

The race will be held in two divisions. Cars of the 1957 to 1963 variety and autos in the 1949 to 1956 class will each have a six-lap trophy dash. The late models will go in a 50-lap main event and the early models will compete in a 30-lap feature.

Cars will be driven by top drivers, including two-time national champ Eddie Gray, Lloyd Dane and Bob Ross, each national champions; Ron Hornaday, Don Noel, Clem Proctor and Marv Porter.

A special Figure Eight race will also be run with Nester Sylvara, Leon Garrett, Joe Drew, Ben Steele, Red Frick and Ed Sauer slated to drive.

Feature Winners Lead Huge Field

Eleven former main event winners at Ascot Park will lead a 50-car Figure Eight field around the Gardena oval tonight.

Led by four-time victor Ben Steele of Gardena, the huge field will begin qualifying at 7 p.m. and open actual competition an hour later.

Steele finished third last week, as Larry Williams notched his initial triumph, but still managed to hold on to his point lead. Steele was not completely shut out last weekend as he won two heat races and the four-lap trophy dash.

FORMER main event winners will also include Leon Garrett, Joe Drew, Jack Frick, Bob Hobbs, Ed Sauer, Hal Pierce, and Frank McEwan and Ed Ferro of Torrance.

Other Torrance drivers entered include Don Silveira, Bob Queener, and Ed Gahler.

TOPPING the night's action will be the 15-lap main event. Other racing will include five 8-lap heat races, a 10-lap semi-main and a 4-lap trophy dash.

Hollypark Will Offer Rich Slate

Close to a million dollars in stakes and purses will be up for grabs at Hollywood Park when the Western Harness Racing Assn. opens its annual 35-day autumn season Tuesday, Oct. 1.

Vice president and general manager Pres Jenuine announced the WHRA feature race scheduled recently, pointing out the slate is topped by the ninth editions of the \$50,000 American Trotting Classic and the \$50,000 American Pacing Classic.

In addition to the pair of \$50,000 specials which are conducted on an invitational basis with the top free-for-all stars in the world invited, WHRA will also hold two \$20,000 four-year-old races, one at each gait, and two \$15,000 free-for-all events, one for trotters and one for pacers.

"THIS WILL be the richest meeting ever staged by Western Harness," Jenuine pointed out.

"We are confident the caliber of horses and drivers that will be attracted both from California and the East will provide the type of major league harness racing Southern California fans have come to expect," he added.

AMONG the leading trotters expected to be on hand for the entire meeting or to fly in for specific feature race engagements are money-winning champion Su Mac Lad, who has accounted for over \$700,000 in purses during his career, last year's American Trotting Classic winner Duke Rodney, Porterhouse, Sprite Rodney, Worth Seem and Rodare.

CRA Ends Campaign Wednesday


Wednesday night will mark the final California Racing Assn. event of the season at Ascot Park in Gardena.

Three of the top sprint car drivers in the country, Allen Heath, Dee Jones and Bob McCoy, will be on hand to attempt to halt the win skein of the leading CRA pilot, Bob Hogle.

Racing will begin at 8:30 p.m. with qualifying runs booked at 7 on the one-half mile clay oval.

Heath, the only one-armed driver in competition, finished second to Hogle last week driving the 427-cubic inch special owned by Vel's Ford in Torrance. Heath is currently 342 points behind Hogle.

Jones, only 40 digits behind Heath, will be bidding for his first main event victory of the season. McCoy has won three main events so far and currently holds down fourth in the point standings.
