Harbor Draws Bead On Second Triumph

Warming up for the opening of the Western State Conference grid campaign, Harbor College will host the Los Angeles State College junior varsity tomorrow night. Harbor chalked up its first win of the season on Saturday with a 32-7 triumph against Palomar as two Seahawk passers bloomed to maturity. All of the Harbor scoring materialized through the air.

Ray Jones opened the tallying with a 22-yard toss to end Steve Cox and then came right back with a 31-yard throw to end Stu Dahlager.

FRESHMAN John Blakemore, an All-City selection last year at Banning High, then entered the fracas and came through with three scoring bombs. One Blakemore toss went 24 yards to Stu Horn and another 58 yards to Dahlager. The final Seahawk TD came on a 37-yard throw from Blakemore to David Backes.

John Bjazevich booted two conversions.

Los Angeles State is attempting a climb back into gridiron power behind new head coach Homer Beatty, formerly of Santa Ana junior college. Most of the State junior varsity men will have the advantage of an additional two year's experience on Harbor. Harbor's first conference foe will be Pierce on Saturday, Oct. 19. While the Seahawks are meeting Los Angeles tomorrow night, all of the other Western State teams will be playing in their first circuit contests.

Sentinels Climb Back to Power

Arch-rival Hawthorne failed to halt Inglewood's return to football power last weekend in the top Southland prep game on tap.

Dave Rench returned the opening kickoff 78 yards for a touchdown to pace Inglewood in a 14-7 triumph over the Cougars.

Inglewood had three touchdowns called back on penalties, fumbled three times and had a pass picked off but still ran its winning streak to three.

LEUZINGER, a co-favorite with Inglewood for the Sky League championship, also remained unbeaten with a 43-0 whitewash of Torrance High. Don House tallied on an 85-yard kickoff runback, a 9-yard run off tackle and a 19-yard pass from Ed Pease.

Another undefeated eleven, Pioneer League title choice Aviation, was carried to its third straight win primarily on the talents of all-everything back Joe Burton.

BURTON TALLIED on 79- and 20-yard gallops and pulled in a 5-yard toss from Gene Campbell for another score. Runningmate Mike Jones also nudged into the act with a 50-yard touchdown as Aviation nudged Culver City, 25-18.

In one of the most exciting games of the weekend, Gardena halted Palos Verdes' extra point attempt with only 4:47 left in the game to preserve a 27-26 decision. In a wild offensive display, Gardena rolled up 327 yards while the Sea Kings accounted for 275.

MIRA COSTA collected its first triumph of the season with a 33-7 duke against still winless Morningside in a penalty laden contest. Mico had previously lost 10-0 to Loyola and 40-13 to Long Beach Poly.

Motorcycle Standards In Danger

Motorcycle riders will take dead aim on existing track marks tomorrow night at Ascot Park in Gardena in the 24th American Motorcycle Assn. flat-track program of the year.

Directed by J. C. Agajanian, racing will get underway at 8:30 with qualifying set for 7 p.m. Sammy Tanner, seeking to wrap up the expert class Ascot championship, will train his sights on Al Gunter's record of 5:51.48 for the 15-lap main event. In a recent victory, Tanner recorded the fastest time for 1963, hitting 5:52.54.

More than 100 riders are scheduled to participate with separate programs planned for the amateur and novice divisions.

Agajanian, Jones' sponsor at Indianapolis, has scheduled his annual East versus West mid-gate program for Sunday night, Oct. 20, with Bob Wente and Mel Kenyon, the top ranking pilots in the nation, scheduled to compete.
