Check Out Furnaces Says Chief

With the fading of September into memories, cold air has begun to circulate about the Southern California area. Many residents will be hanging out extra blankets and lighting the old furnace before too long.

Officials of the Torrance Fire Department, this week sounded a warning to householders who will be relighting the furnace in the weeks to come. Fire Chief J. J. Benner said maximum efficiency can be obtained by following three simple rules: Remove the floor grating or wall panel and see that accumulation of lint and other foreign objects are removed from the enclosed area; Check all burners and the pilot light before replacing the grating or panel and check the burner adjustment; and Call the repairman for any adjustments that are necessary.

The chief said these simple steps will insure proper operation of the furnace and eliminate possible fire hazards.

Nineteen Torrance residents are among 103 persons taking a 13-week lecture series on "Immediate Care of the Sick and Injured" now in session at South Bay Hospital, Redondo Beach.

The course is designed for persons who need advance information in their occupations as policemen, firemen, ambulance drivers and lifeguards, according to Dr. Albert E. Ackroyd, Rolling Hills physician in charge of the series.

Badstuber, Parks and Recreation Department; Thomas Bralley, policeman; Jerry Dunningham, lifeguard, and Philip Edmundson, ambulance service. Subjects include first aid, artificial respiration, shock and bleeding, chest injuries and cardiac resuscitation. Emergencies covered include pediatric, medical, orthopaedic, obstetrical and psychiatric.
