





Grand Opening Set for New Volunteers Bureau

Grand Opening of a new Harbor Volunteer Bureau has been set for Oct. 28, according to officials of the new bureau. Headquarters for the group will be in the San Pedro Community Chest Building at 1427 S. Pacific Ave. Vernon Fay, a retired retail store manager, heads the board of directors for the new group.

The bureau will be modeled after the Long Beach Community Volunteer Office, which was established by the Junior League in the city in 1948. It will serve the area generally bounded by the Harbor Freeway and the ocean, north to Manhattan Beach.

DESIGNED TO bring new residents of the community together to make friends and help others at the same time. The bureau grew out of meetings between the Long Beach Junior League and 24 welfare agencies which serve the southwest area of Los Angeles County.

Staffed by members of the Junior League, the bureau will serve as a clearing house to get volunteer workers for the many welfare organizations which serve the area. Mrs. Robert Cooper has been named executive secretary and will supervise the staff.

Volunteers working out of the Long Beach office put in more than 100,000 hours during 1962, reports the Junior League. It is expected that a similar figure can be reached during the first year of the Harbor Bureau.

NEW PERSONS in the area, or residents with a willingness to work and lend a helping hand are invited to drop into the office Fay said many organizations have already expressed a desire to cooperate with the bureau.

Average Production Job Now Pays \$114.90 Weekly

Average weekly earnings of manufacturing production workers in the Los Angeles-Long Beach metropolitan area have continued to rise and, as of June, 1963, totaled \$114.90 per week.

According to the report by Security First National Bank's research department, this was approximately 10 per cent ahead of the mid-1960 level and nearly 2 per cent above a year ago.

The average weekly earnings for June were 46 cents short of the all-time high of \$115.36 recorded in the local area last December, Security Bank said.

Factory worker earnings in the local area also are above the national average, National-ly, average earnings passed the \$100-per-week level for the first time only last June.

Contributing to the increase in average weekly earnings is a corresponding upward trend in hourly earnings, the bank's report noted.

Locally, manufacturing production employees are averaging a record of \$2.83 per hour, as compared to \$2.75 per hour a year ago. On a national basis, the hourly rate is \$2.46.


