Choosing Right Shade Tree Can Be Troublesome

While any tree, be it deciduous or evergreen, can be classed as a shade tree, the deciduous varieties have one advantage worth noting. In summer when we want their shade, there it is. In winter, when we can get along without shade, the deciduous tree obliges us by dropping its leaves and letting the sun flow through.
 This is not to detract from the wonderful evergreens such as our evergreen oaks and the stately magnolia, which are

widely planted for shade. Where they don't block wanted light and sun in winter, there are no trees more beautiful than these.
 Most of you need no reminder that the best time to plant deciduous areas is now during their leafless, bare-root season. When it comes to choosing the right tree from the many available, however, most gardeners confess a lack of knowledge. We suggest that you rely on the advice of a local California Assn. of Nurserymen member, but if you want a starter here's a favorite foursome for California.

FIRST ON OUR list is the Ginko, or Maidenhair Tree, which in grace and beauty has few rivals in the tree world. An awkward tree in its youth, the Ginko's irregular growth habits become an asset as the tree grows up, its branches spreading artistically from the grayish trunk. The common name derives from a resemblance in shape between the Ginko's leaves and those of the Maidenhair Fern. A ginko leaf is much the larger in this comparison, obviously.
 If the Ginko is a beautiful tree in summer, it becomes even more so in the fall, as the leaves will turn to vivid shades of yellow even in coastal areas where good fall foliage is not too common. This alone makes the tree worth planting. You can grow it in reasonably small gardens, too, beside a patio for better outdoor living in summer, alongside a drive and nearer to the house than many trees permit. The Ginko's roots are seldom a trouble for foundations and walks.
 Ask also about the new variety, "Autumn Gold" Ginko. This is selected and grafted male strain, preferred over the female tree because it does not produce fruit.



THE SECOND tree on our list of four is the Tulip Tree, a tree of towering stature, yet not one to overpower a city garden. Its upright symmetry is as appealing in its way as the unsymmetrical habit of the Ginko is in its way. The foliage of a Tulip Tree is light green, changing to yellow in fall as nights turn colder. This yellowing is more pronounced inland than on the coast; so don't look for too much of it if you live where the ocean's tempering influence is felt.
 A striking feature of the Tulip Tree is its brief flowering period in spring. The cup-shaped flowers somewhat resemble a magnolia blossom, except the coloring is chartreuse with shadings of orange. Altogether a satisfactory tree.

THE MODEST ASH is on our list of favorites because of its quick growth and the wide-spreading branches which symbolize shade-giving qualities. This is a variation of the Arizona Ash, which has been around for a long time. Its foliage is a bright, glossy green, which turns a bright yellow in the fall. Here again, the degree of fall coloring is dependent on the distance one lives from the coast. Inland it is vivid. On the coast, it is yellow, but not intensely so.
 Modesto Ash is well adapted throughout California, being indifferent to soil or climate conditions. Another appealing feature is its ability to maintain appearances through the long summer drought of California.

OUR FOURTH choice is the Chinese Pistachio, a tree that many people hear about when stories on fall foliage are written, but which deserves far more consideration than it gets for other qualities. The Chinese Pistachio is a fast-growing tree with graceful, spreading proportions.
 It is an excellent choice for gardeners with limited space for trees. Try it next to a patio and enjoy the year-round pleasure it affords—heat, green looks during the summer, plus vivid red foliage when fall arrives. This latter aspect is something the Chinese Pistachio is famous for and you will not regret having it in your garden. That we guarantee.

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


