Top Displays Promised for Armed Forces

Some of the latest examples of the 1963-era of the armed forces will be on display for the public at the Torrance Armed Forces Day parade and exhibitions, Saturday, May 18, Walter M. Nollac, parade display chairman, claimed today. Nollac, who is the City Engineer for the city of Torrance, is again filling the role as display chief for the celebration. He said that he expects even a greater number of spectators than last year's estimated 35,000 will visit the display area this year.

THE PARADE general chairman, Fred Rathert, already has forecast that this will again be the largest civic-sponsored military parade in the Southern California area.

Nollac is an experienced public engineer who came to Torrance in August 1959. Immediately prior to that time, he was assistant City Engineer for the city of West Covina.

He is married to the former

Dorothea Louise Sullivan, and they make their family residence at 23305 Ladeene Ave. in Torrance.

NOLLAC IS A second generation native of Southern California; he was born in Monrovia, and was graduated from Monrovia High School. He received a bachelor of engineering degree at the University of Southern California in 1948 following a bachelor of science degree with the U.S. Navy in 1946.

A veterans of three years service with the Navy during World War II, he served in the Pacific area. He is now a lieutenant commander in the Naval Reserve, and is commanding officer of a service division at the Hawthorne, Calif., Naval Reserve Training Center.

This year will be Nollac's second as chairman of the Torrance Armed Forces Day parade display program.
