(Continued from Page 1) The youths began to disrobe her. She said she reported hearing a car and the youth returned her clothing.

THE SECOND youth apologized for the kidnapping at this point, she said, and left the scene after making arrangements to meet his companion later.

After the suspect had left, the other youth took the victim to a Gardena apartment and forced her and the child inside. She was assaulted twice in the apartment, she reported.

During the time she was there with one suspect, the other called and asked to speak to her, telling her he was sorry and asking if she had been hurt. She memorized the phone number in the apartment while using the instrument, and later was able to give it to police.

THE NUMBER led to the apartment occupied by Noday, and both suspects were arrested there shortly after midnight Friday morning.

McSherry denied involvement in the rape but did admit his part of the kidnapping, police said.

Under normal procedures, youths charged with a crime are certified to Juvenile Court for hearings and disposition. Because of the nature of the kidnapping and rape, however, Torrance officers said they would urge that the district attorney petition to have the pair tried as adults.

Under terms of the "Little Lindberg Law," the pair could be liable for penalties which permit death for persons over 18 and life imprisonment without possibility of parole for those under 18.


