Sprinkle with mixture of 2 tps. brown sugar and ¼ tsp. dry mustard. Ten minutes before chicken is done, place peaches on foil; broil until tinged with brown.

**Fried:** Use your favorite frying method. When chicken is tender, drain excess fat from pan, add drained cling peach halves. Sprinkle with dill, thyme or rosemary. Heat 8 to 10 minutes.
