El Camino Instructor Plans Talk

Following appearance on lecture platforms throughout the world, Julius Sumner Miller will address an El Camino College audience April 26 at 8 p.m. in the Campus Center.

Miller, who has been a member of the college faculty for the past 10 years, will lecture and present "Some Dramatic Demonstrations in Physics." Noted for his television series and the development of toys which illustrate physical phenomena, Miller stresses that the demonstrations will be of instructional value for children, as well as adults.

No admission will be charged for the lecture; the theater was filled to capacity when Miller lectured a year ago.

MILLER HAS been invited to lecture on physics demonstrations during the coming summer at the University of Uppsala in Sweden.

The invitation was extended by the Institute of Physics as a result of two discourses delivered in the fall of 1962 by Miller while he was on sabbatical leave of absence from El Camino College.

Miller's eight-week lecture series will be attended by European physics instructors. Supported by the Swedish government and the University Institute, the series will probably be televised from Stockholm.

AT THE INVITATION of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development in Paris, Miller will compile a monograph on demonstrations in physics for use by the European teachers.

Miller has served as a consultant with the OECD, an international body in which the United States holds membership.

HAM MELBA ← Good Idea!

Here's ham with a golden garnish of canned cling peach halves, hot—new, simple, delicious!
Bake ham according to wrapper directions in aluminum foil-lined pan. Melt 10-oz. glass red raspberry jelly; place spoonful in each of 6 drained peach halves. Remove ham from oven 30 minutes before end of baking time. Pour off drippings, remove outer skin and score fat. Brush with jelly; return to oven. Continue baking 30 minutes, brushing frequently with jelly. Add peaches during last 10 minutes of baking.
Remember: Only cling peaches hold their shape and sunny color during heating.
