Watch Judo In Action

Members of the Torrance Optimist Club got a first hand look at the techniques of the ancient art of judo during their Monday evening meeting.

Two judo experts representing the U. S. Air Force, explained the history of the art, explained the techniques, and then demonstrated each of the several basic judo moves.

Optimist Ernie Dandoy introduced the program which was under the direction of S/Sgt. William D. Edwards of the Air Force.

Assisting in the demonstrations and discussion were Sergeants Staubly, Tyrell, and Graham, who showed that judo was primarily a defensive action.

Use of judo by U.S. military forces was accelerated following the Korean War, the service club members were told. At that time only two of the nation's major colleges were conducting classes in judo. At the present time, nearly all major schools have classes, and in many colleges judo has taken its place as a college sport, according to Optimist Roy Zhe, who reported the program.

Enjoying the demonstrations were seven members of the Redondo Beach Optimist Club, who had been introduced by President R. K. Petrat earlier.
