



NEW MORTUARY . . . A new \$500,000 facility for the Ingledwood Cemetery-Mortuary was officially opened Monday evening at the Ingledwood Park Cemetery. The new facility is located at the Manchester gate of the cemetery. It will offer complete mortuary service on the cemetery grounds and has a chapel within the building which will seat 200 persons. Charles B. Cole will be manager of the firm, according to Mason Lettau, president of Ingledwood Park Cemetery.

Ingledwood Park Cemetery was founded in 1902 by George Lettau and has grown to be one of the finest cemeteries in the country with an endowment care fund of over 5 1/2 million dollars.

MORE THAN 200,000 families of the greater Los Angeles area have selected Ingledwood Park Cemetery as a final resting place. Lettau explained that the board of directors had long considered erecting a mortuary facility and last fall determined to go ahead with the mortuary and "spare no expense in providing the finest services possible."

Lettau said that the new mortuary within the grounds of the cemetery would eliminate the need for funeral processions and should lessen traffic congestion in the area.
