Hawks Blank SHS in Final

A dismal season came to a dismal end for South High on Tuesday as the Spartans closed out the Bay League baseball campaign with a 6-0 loss to Redondo.

Despite the presence of one of the league's top hurlers in Eric Spellman, the error-happy, hitless Spartans wound up with a 5-11 league record and a 7-15 overall mark.

On Tuesday, it was the same old story that South coach Jerry McVaine has seen so many times this season as Spellman flipped a five hitter, but four Spartan errors allowed five unearned runs.

LACK OF hitting as usual contributed to the South defeat as Redondo hurler Ray Graves kept his club just one game behind league-leading Hawthorne by chalking up a three hitter.

Spellman whiffed three men and walked an equal number while Graves was doing only slightly better, striking out five men and walking but one. REDONDO slipped two runs across in the first frame and

added four more tallies in the fourth stanza. South managed its first hit, a single by Tom Adkins, in the second inning, and had to wait until Spellman could connect in the sixth before getting another man on base via the legitimate route.

Spellman, who ended up with a 4-5 league mark and a 5-6 overall standard, turned in a remarkable earned-run average. In the 58 frames he toiled on the hill, the senior right-hander had a 1.45 ERA as he gave up but 12 earned runs.

THE ALL-LEAGUE chucker gave up 45 hits, walked 30 men and whiffed 72 batters. Outfielder John Minech wound up as the Spartan's top stickman, going 13 for 45 at the dish for a .289 average. As coach McVaine said, "How is that for an offense."

El Camino Eyes Loop Golf Title

In a dual match with East Los Angeles, Friday, May 3, the Warrior linksters netted a team medal score of 431, or one under par.

Led by Steve Hallberg, who shot 69, three under par, the Tribe link-squad defeated the East Los Angeles Huskies, 52-2, in match play on the Alondra Park Golf course.

DAVE SCOTT, 70, and Dan Titus, 71, joined Hallberg in recording rounds below par.

Larry Sprengel shot an even par 72 while Les Warr, 74, and Ken Ghirardi, 75, completed the Warrior scoring with two-over and three-over rounds, respectively.

FOR HALLBERG, it was his second 69 for the season; he had a three-under par mark in a practice match against Orange Coast earlier in the year.

The Warriors will travel to San Diego and participate in the Metropolitan Conference championships, Monday.

COMPETITION in the championships is of a one-day 36-hole medal variety. Six men from each team participate, each playing 36 holes of golf.

If the medal scores recorded by the Warriors last week are any indication they should have little trouble at Torrey Pines Country Club.

HOWEVER, coach Al Greenleaf feels the 36-hole competition will make a difference.

"Playing 36 holes in one day is not the same as shooting 18 holes of match play," Greenleaf said.

"TORREY PINES, depending on wind conditions, can be a very difficult course," the golf coach commented.

Both the Metro tournament and the State championships are scheduled on the Torrey Pines course this year.

"WE SHOULD have a slight advantage in the State tournament since we will be playing on the same course two weeks in a row," Greenleaf added.

The State meet is scheduled for May 20.



Opens Today Nine-Race Program Begins 55-Day Hollypark Meeting

Headlining the attractive nine-race menu on opening day at the plush "track of the lakes and flowers" in Inglewood will be the \$20,000 added Premiere Handicap, traditional starting point for Hollypark's affluent stakes program.

AN OUTSTANDING band has been lured into the Premiere, a six-furlong speed-spectacular.

Among 19 nominees are Fred W. Hooper's "terrible twosome" of Crozier and Wint only; Schliz and Anderson's elusive Testum; Mr. and Mrs. L. K. Shapiro's nimble Native Diver; Lou Doherty's Tommy Lee, victory in the '59 Kentucky Derby; Helen L. Kenaston's Revel, a veteran of the sprint wars; Malcolm Shelton's consistent Double Lea and Lionel Sternberger's versatile Doc Jockey.

THIRTY-FOUR stakes for a total of approximately \$1,290,000 will be decided during the meeting, climaxed July 13 by the \$182,100 Hollywood Gold Cup which will match many of America's finest handicap stars at the classic distance of one and one-quarter miles.

Also on the rich stakes slate are three other hundred-grand-ers—The Californian on June 1; the Hollywood Derby on San Diego Freeway in the North Long Beach area.

Qualifying starts at 2:30 p.m., with eliminations getting underway at 7 p.m.
