Friday evening, May 17, we'll be there from 7 to 10 p.m. and Sunday, May 19, the show will be open from 1 to 5 p.m.

There will be a great variety of work to see. Room 2 will show drawings by students of Willie Suzuki, Lyle Clark, and Mildred Walker. Room 3 will have an array of jewelry and crafts done by Richard Oliver's classes. Room 5 will exhibit all types of ceramic pots, bowls, vases, etc. by Joe Gadden's students.

LOOK FOR the work of Sam Houston and buy something if you get the chance. I bought two pots last year at the show and they still look good on my fireplace mantle. Bob Niece and I will share room 6. Bob will show plans and models from his Industrial Design students, whose contemporary ideas on home and community planning are breathtaking.

My art structure students will show stables, masks, collages, design problems (some answers too, I hope) and my lettering students will have a few good examples of ways that lettering can be done today.

Lettering is tough to learn and harder yet to become anything beyond an amateur—but I'm happy with many students' progress. Room 7 will have the fine work by Charles Bluske's students in design and advertising design. The quality of this work will amaze you.

THE PAINTING room, No. 8, will be the gallery where you can see oil paintings and watercolors by students of Mildred Walker, and Willie Suzuki. Most of the work will be on sale and it's really a good time to buy that piece of jewelry you've been wanting, that bowl you could use for your dining room or that painting you need for that blank wall over your couch.

On Saturday morning, all of the instructors will be there for a special program and showing for the local high school art teachers and their best students. The program will be in our patio followed by refreshments and viewing of the exhibition.

**YWCA Receives \$12,576 Community Chest Allotment**

The YWCA of Torrance has received an allotment of \$12,576 from the Los Angeles Community Chest.

Announcement of the 1963-64 Chest-United Way allocations to Harbor area agencies was made by Fred W. Mill, board chairman for the chest in the Harbor area.

In reporting allocations Mill said: "It's gratifying to know that money raised in this area returns to Harbor communities in the form of services."

There are more than 17 Chest-supported health, welfare and youth agencies serving the Harbor area. Many of these are located in San Pedro.

A major allotment of \$80,264 went to the Harbor area YWCA, which has offices in San Pedro and Wilmington.

THE BOYS' CLUB of San Pedro was allotted \$30,696; Homer Toberman Settlement House, \$31,968; Beacon Light Mission, \$16,152; Seamen's Church Institute of Los Angeles, \$9,582; St. Vincent de Paul Society—Catholic Maritime Clubs, \$20,892.

Agencies with offices in the Harbor area shared in the overall allocations made to the following: Catholic Welfare Bureau, \$416,780; Catholic Youth Or-

ganization, \$316,320; Family Service of Los Angeles Area, \$252,522; Neighborhood Youth Assn., \$73,088; Girl Scouts, Los Angeles Council, \$161,604; Salvation Army, \$364,908 and Welfare Planning Council \$274,512.

Los Angeles District 10 PTA, which maintains a health and dental clinic in San Pedro, received \$159,756.

Agencies located in other areas that provided vital services to the Harbor communities were Childrens Hospital, \$713,688; Orthopaedic Hospital, \$295,560 and the Camp Fire Girls, Los Angeles Council, \$109,560.
