Largest Missile Model Display Here Saturday

The largest missile model display ever assembled will be a feature of this year's Armed Forces Day celebration in Torrance Saturday when Assistant Secretary of Defense Norman S. Paul officially opens the exhibit area to the public. The space launch and ballistic model exhibit was arranged for by Maj. Gen. Ben I. Funk, Commander, Space Systems Division, Inglewood. The division is the Air Force's manager for most of the military space activity.

General Funk said that a model of the Mercury-Atlas rocket used by John Glenn in his orbital flight will be displayed. The Space Systems Division participated in this, as well as other Mercury flights, by providing the Mercury-Atlas rock-

et booster which hurled Glenn into space.

THERE ALSO will be a model of the Mercury-Atlas, the Agena, the Blue Scout which was recently used to launch a navigational satellite, Gemini the forthcoming two-man space capsule, Dyna-Soar the manned space glider, and display models of rocket launch facilities at Vandenberg and Cape Canaveral.

A preview of the future will be the model of the Titan III Integrate-Transfer-Launch facility which is presently being built at Cape Canaveral for the Space Systems Division. This new concept in rocket launches will permit the Air Force to assemble, checkout and move a space vehicle to the launch pad in a ready to fire condition. Previously, missiles and vehicles have been assembled on the pad. The new ITL system will permit greater speed in rocket launches.
