

Winonly Goes at Hollypark

One of Hollywood Park's most interesting and popular stakes events the \$25,000 added Hollywood Express Handicap, will climax the first full week of action Saturday at the "track of the lakes and flowers" in Inglewood.

Heading the field for the 5 1/2-furlong Hollywood Express will be Fred W. Hooper's Winonly, who appears well on the road to successfully defending his 1962 title as Hollypark sprint champion. The son of Olympia-Sickle

won scored an impressive repeat victory in the opening day \$22,550 Hollywood Premiere Handicap last Thursday and will be after a second straight Hollywood Express win. WINONLY, praised as "bet-

ter than ever" by trainer J. E. (Cotton) Tinsley, nabbed the 1962 Express in the excellent time of 1:03 1/5, four-fifths of a second off the world's record set by Porterhouse in his '57 triumph.

Among those ready to tackle Winonly are Crazy Kid, Double Lea, Kisco Kid, Testum, Revel and Native Diver. Crazy Kid, who owns the world's record of 1:07 4/5 for six furlongs, is on the comeback path and could be Winonly's most serious rival if trainer John Canty has him up to his form of last year.

DOUBLE LEA and Kisco Kid chased Winonly in the Hollywood Premiere, finishing second and third, respectively, after a front-running duel that resulted in some dizzy fractional times.

Kisco Kid, an arrival from New York only three days before the Premiere, was particularly impressive, considering the game manner in which he hung on after losing command.

THE JUNIOR League Stakes tomorrow is expected to mark the debut of Mr. and Mrs. Elwood Johnston's Sweet and Fleet, a filly from the initial crop of the stallion Fleet Nasrullah, Hollywood Park's track record-holder for six furlongs.

Included among nominees for the Junior League are Betty Pueblo, My Bright Baby, Loukahl, Nevada a Princess, Foxy Fanny, Shady Deal, Juanita Mia, Kimeo, and Fair Manzanita.

Parnelli Jones Unofficially Snaps Brickyard Record

Once again making Indianapolis history, Torrance's Parnelli Jones spun around the brickyard oval at over 152 miles per hour the past week to record the fastest unofficial time ever turned on the famed track.

Jones, one-time Indy rookie-of-the-year, last year became the first man to clock the course over 150 m.p.h. and put in his bid for another pole position with his phenomenal time.

The Torrance ace, only 29 years old, appears well on his way to wrapping up a second straight USAC national sprint car championship this season.

'Big Four' Guide Ascot Park Field

Neil Keen, Sammy Tanner, Jack O'Brien and Al Gunter, the "Big Four" of flat track motorcycle racing, rub handle bars for the fifth time of the 1963 season tomorrow night at Ascot Park in Gardena, with the 15-lap main event rated strictly a tossup.

Big news for two wheeling fans this month has been the spectacular comeback of Keen of Pasadena and Tanner of Bellflower, who are red-hot again after a cooling-off period last season.

O'Brien of Santa Monica is the defending Ascot champ on the half-mile oval although Gunter of Alhambra edged him by one point for the 1962 American Motorcycle Association all-tracks championship.

RATED CLOSELY behind the top four riders are Don Hawley of Inglewood, veteran of 14 years on Southland smoke paths; Ralph White of San Diego, 1963 national 200-mile Daytona road racing champ; Stu Morley of Los Angeles, holder of the Ascot one-lap record of 22.75; Dick Hammer of Lakewood, Clyde Litch of Baldwin Park, and Blackie Bruce of Norwalk.

Amateur and novice division main events are also rated as tossups with a different winner coming up each week in both AMA classes.

Cards Snare League Lead

Jumping off to a fast start in the Torrance National Little League pennant chase, the Cardinals posted two straight triumphs to spark the first week of Major League action. Behind the four-hit hurling of Randy Bishop, the Cards earned a 3-2 triumph over the Angels, then came back to whip the same club 5-2 behind the mound artistry of Jim Fox.

In the first game, Bishop whiffed nine men as Daren Vom Steeg and John Clayton supplied the hitting punch. Fox gave up but two hits in the second game and sent 13 men down swinging as Pete Lorenzo, Bob Jones, Lonnie Patterson and Tim Dennis drove in runs.

CHUCK O'BRIEN bashed a home run for the Angeles in the second contest. The Phillies also started quickly by chalking up 5-1 and 4-1 triumphs over the Yankees. Mike Abrams outdueled Phillip Roeder to gain the win in the first game as he whiffed nine men.

CRAIG PRESTON fanned 10 batters and allowed four hits in the second encounter as the Phillies remained in a first place tie with the Cards. Other major league action saw the Cubs take a 2-1 duke from the Braves in a red-hot mound war. Ken Waters allowed four hits and whiffed 12 to grab the win from Mark Marguard, who sent 13 batters down swinging and gave up three hits.

WATERS AND Jim Ellsberry collected RBIs for the winners while Steve Buckman drove across the lone Brave tally.

Major league action proved to be slightly more topsy-turvy. The Angels came through with a one-sided 16-7 triumph over the Phillies, then proceeded to drop an equally one-sided 15-8 nod to the Cards.

IN THE ANGEL-Phillie contest, Ron Lind gave up five hits to capture the nod, striking out 13 men in the process. The Cards went with Mark Judd and Larry Affentranger on the hill against the Angels, and the duo limited the losers to five hits.

Mike Reid received the win as the Cards reversed roles and took a 14-9 drubbing from the Dodgers. Reid whiffed six men and gave up three hits to subdue the Cards.

IN ANOTHER high-scoring fray, Frank Maynard Jr. gave up 15 hits but still earned a 17-12 win against the Braves. The only other minor league tilt scheduled found the Cubs whipping the Yankees by a 9-0 count.

Jerry Pagel pushed a third-strike by seven men and gave up three safeties to collect the triumph. A Yank duo of Randy Lenchan and Dennis Kellenberger issued only four bingles to the winners and the two whiffed eight Cubs.
