Kathy Baker Sees Gordon Cooper's Hawaiian Arrival

Now a resident of Honolulu, Kathy Baker witnessed the entrance of the Kearsage into Pearl Harbor and the unloading of the capsule which carried Gordon Cooper on his 22

mond Head, 2,000 miles farther than Midway Island where he landed.

"THEN I DROVE the 10 miles to Pearl Harbor and finally got into the base after being checked to see that I wasn't carrying a camera. The Kearsage was docked and they were getting ready to unload the capsule. A loudspeaker was blaring the whole time emphatically telling the people that under no circumstances should any pictures be taken."

"They rolled the capsule out on deck. It was all black from the heat of the re-entry into the earth's atmosphere and there was also the remains of an American flag that had been badly burned at the same time. They loaded the capsule on a special truck and drove away."
