

Keeping Blood Supplies Filled a Red Cross Job

Blood—a living tissue is needed (eight pints every minute of every day), to treat the ill and injured.

This community held an opportunity to see that this greatest miracle medicine of all is available when needed by participating in the public blood bank to be sponsored by the Torrance-Lomita Red Cross branch Thursday.

Equipment and staff to accommodate 275 donors will be on hand at the Elks Lodge, 1820 Abalone, from 2:30 to 7 p.m.

THURSDAY'S blood bank was one of four scheduled annually for the public by the local Red Cross branch.

Four bloodmobiles, the large grey trucks which carry supplies necessary to set up a blood collection center, are sent out Monday through Friday to communities throughout Los Angeles and Orange counties by the regional blood service.

Mrs. Orsini says providing collection quotas are met for each mobile, the minimum regular orders for the 202 hospitals totaling from 700 to 800 pints of blood each day, can be filled.

REGULAR ROUNDS to the big hospitals are called "milk runs" because it is known that each day a particular hospital will conduct an eight-day play school for children 2 to 5 years of age.

two most common blood types. Smaller hospitals place orders as their supply runs low. Emergency deliveries are sent by volunteer drivers, by taxi, and by private car.

"The problem is to keep the blood—all different types—coming in and going out," Mrs. Orsini says. "If you want a quart of milk a day, you don't want a whole month's supply on your doorstep one morning. The blood problem is the same."

As community blood chairman, she stresses the importance of regular giving in time of health to insure an ample supply in time of need.

She explains that credit for a blood donation is good until used.

IN ADDITION to providing protection for yourself, your immediate family, and your fellow workers and friends, whenever and wherever blood is needed, by giving blood through Red Cross you save money.

Without Red Cross credit, you would have to pay at least \$25 per pint for blood, or procure enough donors to replace the blood used, adds the chairman.

Volunteers like Mrs. Orsini and the other local women who will staff the Torrance bloodmobile, enable Red Cross to keep operating costs at a minimum.

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HOSPITALS receiving Red Cross-collected blood help defray part of the cost of collecting, processing and distributing blood by sharing this expense to the extent of \$5.15 per pint.

Out of the funds contributed during the annual Red Cross fund campaign, Red Cross pays other costs of the service. Mrs. Orsini declares that no service of the American Red Cross depends more on the support of the public at large than does the blood program.

"In practical terms this broad public support means the work of volunteers, the contribution of money, and finally, the consent of and action by an adequate number of blood donors," she states.

The goal aimed at, of course, is that the patient who needs whole blood or blood derivatives will get what he needs.
