

Legal Shuffling Defeats Move for Anti-Smut Bill

 On Wednesday, May 29, in compliance with a notice given to the Assembly previously, I moved that my Assembly Bill 3, relating to indecent materials, be withdrawn from the Assembly Committee on Crimi-

nal Procedure, where it had been killed. This motion by me was for the purpose of allowing all members of the Assembly to debate the bill on the floor of the Assembly. Assemblyman Gordon H. Winton, (Democrat) of Merced, and chairman of the commit-

tee that had killed the bill, moved that my motion be laid on the table. In plain English this was a parliamentary effort to keep the Assembly from hearing the bill. Winton's motion was seconded by Jerome R. Waldie, (Democrat) of Antioch.

I MADE the proper demand for a roll call vote and received the necessary second. Also, the required number of assemblymen were rising to support my demand for a roll call, but the Right Honorable Jesse M. Unruh, (Democrat) of Inglewood, and Speaker of the As-

sembly, was in his chair as Speaker and announced that Winton's motion to table my motion to withdraw the bill from committee was carried by a voice vote. I challenged the action of Speaker Unruh as illegal, unfair, unethical, and contrary to

the rules of the Assembly. Many Democrats and Republicans shouted their agreement with me and their disapproval of the arbitrary action by the Right Honorable Jesse M. Unruh, but he paid no attention because he regards his word as the supreme law of

the land. He is, indeed powerful at present!
 MY NEXT STEP was to move that my Assembly Bill 14, relating to indecent materials, be withdrawn from the same committee that killed my Assembly Bill 3. Assemblyman Winton again made a motion that my motion be laid on the table and once more Assemblyman Waldie seconded the motion of Winton. I demanded a roll call vote and received the

support of Assemblyman Charles Conrad (Republican) of Sherman Oaks; as well as the support of Assemblyman Frank Lanterman (Republican) of La Canada.

The clerk at the desk began to call the roll but I noticed that some assemblymen had left and others were leaving and, hence, before the vote was announced I asked for a "Call of the Assembly," which means that the Sergeant-at-Arms and his deputies are to prevent the escape of any members and brings those not there to the floor. My motion for this "Call of the Assembly" was seconded by Frank Lanterman (Republican) of La Canada.

THE FOLLOWING assemblymen voted against my getting all members on the floor: Allen, Ashcraft, Badham, Barnes, Belotti, Burgener, Carrell, Conrad, Dannemeyer, Davis, Deukmejian, Donovan, Hinckley, Kennick, Lanterman, Marks, Meyers, Milias, Stevens, Thelin, Thomas and Whetmore — a total of 23 to get all members on the floor and this included both Republicans and Democrats.

The following assemblymen voted against my getting all members on the floor: Alquist, Bane, Bee, Booth, Casey, Cologne (Republican), Crown, Cusanovich (Republican), Danielson, Elliott, Foran, Frew, Gaffney, Garrigus, Gonsalves, Greene, Lunardi, Monagan (Republican), Moreno, Porter, Powers, Ryan, Veysey (Republican), Waite, Waldie, Warren, Winton, Young, Zenovich and Unruh, 30 opposed to my getting all members of the floor for a vote on my A.B. 14. Notice that all of these were Democrats except Cologne, Cusanovich, Monagan and Veysey, who are registered Republicans.

HAVING FAILED to get all members on the floor to vote for my A.B. 14, the next step was to get a recorded roll call. My motion to withdraw my Assembly Bill 14 from committee to the floor was shelved by Winton's motion to table (kill) the bill. Those voting "aye" were voting to kill the bill by tabling. They were: Alquist, Bane, Bee, Beilenson, Belotti (Republican), Booth, Britschgi (Republican), Crown, Danielson, Dannemeyer, Dills, Elliott, Ferrell, Foran, Frew, Gaffney, Garrigus, Gonsalves, Greene, Johnson, Kennick, Knox, Lunardi, Marks (Republican), Meyers, Mills, Moreno, Pattee (Republican), Petris, Porter, Powers, Rumpf, Ryan, Song, Stanton, Waite, Waldie, Warren, Williamson, Willson, Winton, Young, Z'berg, Zenovich and Unruh — a total of 45. Notice that all were Democrats except Belotti, Britschgi, Marks, and Pattee who are registered Republicans. There were 45 votes against me.

Those voting with me to take the bill out of committee were Allen (Democrat), Ashcraft, Badham, Barnes, Burgener, Carrell (Democrat), Collier, Cologne, Conrad, Cusanovich, Deukmejian, Donovan, Hinckley, Holmes, Lanterman, Milias, Monagan, Mulford, Stevens, Thelin, Thomas (Democrat), Veysey and Whetmore. There were 24 votes for me including three Democrats.
