## Law in Action

Thelma, a "girl Friday" for Smith's cafe did the bookkeeping, answered the telephone, sent out billings, and, in all, ran the office. She could make bank deposits, and also withdraw up to \$1,000, mostly to make change. She had to redeposit this money the next day.

Thelma liked nice things, alas, and figured out a way to get them. Each month Smith's would get a big check from the Credit Card company for meals charged. Because of different accounting periods, it was hard to tell just what was due from the Credit Card people.

TAKING the big check of about \$5,000, Thelma would show the bank clerk five \$1,000 deposits. It would look as if she were depositing \$1,000, the amount used for change, (and, incidentally, unbeknownst to the clerk, keeping the rest of the \$5,000 check for herself). Thelma told the bank clerk that she did this for "bookkeeping purposes." And he believed her.

Smith discovered the thefts, but Thelma was broke. She could not pay back the \$11,000 she had taken. Smith sued the bank, saying that it should have detected and reported to Smith: it was partly their fault that he lost his money.

The court agreed. The bank should have detected Thelma's phony deposit slips. The bank had to pay Smith's losses.

THE BANK owes all of its depositors a duty to handle deposits with care and show accurately the banks transactions. Otherwise it will be liable for damages. A bank has an absolute duty to know a depositor's signature. If a bank permits money to be taken out of your account because of forgeries, the bank is responsible even though the forgeries are hard to detect.

## Job Future Needs Care In Planning

High school graduates have been advised by Albert B. Tieburg, director of the California State Employment Service, to consider their job futures carefully.

In an open letter to the graduates, Tieburg reminded the graduates that a high school diploma is not always a passport into better jobs in this "jet-propelled, automated age of electro-mechanical marvels."

TIEBURG INVITED those persons seeking summer jobs to help pay the bills for college to contact the nearest office of the California State Employment Service as soon as possible. The department found jobs for more than 154,000 high school graduates last year.

For the student who is ending his formal education with high school, the service maintains counseling, testing and placement services in all local offices.

WHILE addressing the graduates, Tieburg also called upon employers to provide on-the-job training opportunities wherever possible.
