Board OK's Language Proposal

Discussion of the language program in elementary schools led to the approval of the district's initial efforts by the Board of Education Monday evening.

The State Legislature now requires language instruction in certain grades, but the legislature adjourned without vot-

ing funds for the program. Local officials will send a resolution to the State School Board Assn. asking for texts.

A training program in cooperation with the universities and colleges is presently being established. Dr. A. N. Posner, assistant superintendent for instruction, said that Torrance will have enough trained teachers to begin Spanish in-

struction in the seventh grade in February.

The board approved the program on motion of William Hanson, and voted \$1400 to employ teachers to prepare materials for the program during August.
