

### Father Kearney In Europe; to See Pope Paul

The Rt. Rev. Joseph V. Kearney, spiritual director of the Catholic Labor Institute, has left for a two-month tour of Europe. Father Kearney will visit Germany, Italy, Spain, and France to observe business and social conditions. While in Rome, Father Kearney will have an audience with Pope Paul VI. He will return to the United States in early September.

### Summer Film Series at Long Beach Opens Soon

Films from France, England, Japan, and the United States will be shown at Long Beach State College little theater this summer. The film series will begin July 13. "My Uncle," the French sequel to "Mr. Hulot's Holiday," will screen July 13 with Jacques Tati as Mr. Hulot. The silent film is a hilarious battle with automation, and Tati received good reviews for the portrayal of the little man who demonstrates a complete inability to control the inanimate and the mechanical.

### Youth Band Gets Bid to Perform At World's Fair

The Torrance Area Youth Band has received an official invitation to perform at the New York World's Fair in the summer of 1964. According to James Van Dyck, director of the Youth Band, the date of the band's performance is set for Aug. 7, 1964, and is part of the cultural program being sponsored by the New York World's Fair Corp. The band received the invitation after submitting recordings, programs of past public concerts, and recommendations from two leading music critics from universities in the Los Angeles area. The band will go to New York around Aug. 1, 1964, and spend two weeks there and in Washington, D. C. Besides playing at the World's Fair, it also will give a concert at the Walter Damrosch Band Shell in the Lincoln Center, the world's newest and largest cultural center. While in Washington, D. C., the band hopes to be able to take part in the President's "Concerts for Youths" on the White House lawn. The band will fly on jet airliner from Los Angeles to New York and return. Band members will pay their own transportation and the youth band organization will furnish food and lodging for the two-weeks jaunt. The trip is being planned as a combined cultural, musical, and educational experience for the local young musicians, Van Dyck said.

### Proposed Tax Hike Cut to 11.4 Cents

Supervisors recently slashed \$12.7 million from the preliminary county budget to cut in half the proposed tax hike during a marathon budget session. The cuts will reduce the proposed tax hike to 11.4 cents per \$100 assessed valuation. The tax rate for 1963-64 is expected to be \$2.1960 per \$100, compared with the current \$2.0818.

### YMCA Sets High Sierras Camp Trips

The Torrance Y.M.C.A. has scheduled two camping trips to the High Sierras for teenage boys early this summer which will afford fishing, hiking, boating, and camping. Toulumne Base Camp, July 13-20, for boys 12 and up, and the Vogelsang Pass Back Hike, July 13-20, for boys 14 and up, are scheduled to provide trips in and around Toulumne Meadow and Yosemite Park, at 8,000 to 12,000 feet in the High Sierras. Backpackers will hike across historic Vogelsang Pass to the strains of "Happy Wanderer," scale Half Dome and climb down into Yosemite Valley to be greeted by Torrance Family Campers.
