## Tempers Rise Along Picket Lines Sunday

Indications that tempers are fraying along the sidelines where integrationists have been picketing a Torrance housing development to support their claims of discrimination were reported to Torrance police Sunday.

Bill Spies, who lives at 23422 Evalyn, told officers he was knocked down while trying to take a picture near the Southwood Riviera sales offices near his home. A press-type camera he was holding was broken and the aerial was broken from a portable radio he held.

Spies told police he was standing on the sidewalk when someone strode up behind him, bumped him over, and continued on towards the sales offices.

TWO representatives of Congress of Racial Equality also reported trouble, saying someone in a white, two-door Cadillac tried twice to run them down.

Clifford E. Mosby, 17, and Edward J. Lessin, 23, both students living in Los Angeles, said the driver attempted to run them down twice in an alley behind the 23400 block of Anza Ave. Mrs. Robert Joslyn, living at 23405 Anza Ave., told police she heard the auto, and looked out to see the white automobile backing from the alley driveway of her home.

A CHECK OF the license number given to police led to a previous owner who said the car had been sold several months ago. Police traced the current owner of the vehicle and are questioning him and witnesses.

Beyond these isolated incidents, picketing was quiet over the weekend despite counter pickets which formed across the street from the Congress of Racial Equality demonstrators.
