

### Board Votes to Establish New Orthopedic Program

Members of the Torrance Board of Education voted Monday evening to establish a special program for elementary orthopedic and delicate children. Torrance children needing the special program have attended classes in Lennox previously.

The trustees voted to establish the program after receiving a report which said the district could maintain its own program at the same cost per pupil it had previously paid to the Lennox district.

The action became necessary when the Lennox district dropped its orthopedic program because of financial difficulties occasioned when an override tax was defeated this year. The Torrance program will have 14 children enrolled in it this year, and will cost an average of \$252 per pupil.
