Civic Symphony Slates Concert In Memory of Former Secretary

Robert De Simone will give the premier Los Angeles performance of the Piano Concerto by N. Rimsky-Korsakow opus 30 at the coming concert of the South Bay Civic Symphony with Elyse Aehle conducting at Redondo High School Auditorium on Thursday, Dec. 5 at 8:15 p.m.

"This is one of Rimsky-Korsakow's greatest compositions, but due to the fact that the orchestra parts are not printed in this country and are not available through the usual channels, it has been necessary to postpone this concert to a week later than the originally scheduled November date," the director said.

Maestro Aehle has chosen Mendelssohn's "Scotch" symphony for this program. The first and second and last movements of this are extremely brilliant and full of lilting Scotch melodies but the lovely "Adagio" vies with all others

for the title of the most heavenly music ever written.

IT IS THIS exquisite adagio which Elyse Aehle has dedicated to the memory of Viola Niland, secretary of the South Bay Civic Symphony Board for 16 years, "one of the kindest and most beloved citizens of this area and dear friend of the orchestra and its conductor." Mrs. Niland also was first teacher of soloist Robert De Simone and encouraged and inspired him ever since.

The program will close with Danes Polovtsiennes by A.
