Construction of more than one building on one recorded lot replaces an emergency ordinance adopted in August. The new ordinance will exempt manufacturing and commercial zones under certain conditions.

The ordinance prohibiting residential buildings in C-1 and C-2 zones also would require a minimum of three units on R-3 property. The council will receive two ordinances, one prohibiting residential buildings in any commercial zone, and one prohibiting both residential and commercial buildings on the same lot.

The council will meet at 5:30 p.m. in the council chambers at City Hall.




CLUB MEMBERS will clean the building both before and after the event, produce and display posters advertising the hootenanny, and sell tickets throughout the area.
