

Army Reserve Offers New Training Choice

For the first time, a young man enlisting in the Army Reserve can choose his Army job and with it, the amount of time he will spend on active duty. This was pointed out today by Maj. Robert E. Higgins, officer in charge of the Ft. MacArthur U. S. Army Reserve Center, as he announced a number of vacancies in Ft. MacArthur Reserve units.

Under the Reserve Enlistment Program of 1963, the prospective Reservist will enlist for a specific vacancy in a unit. Four to 18 months training on active duty will be required, depending entirely on the Army job he chooses.

AT FT. MACARTHUR vacancies exist for parachutists, supply specialists, radio announcers, truck drivers, script writers, linguists, radio operators and repairmen, mechanics, intelligence specialists, personnel specialists, offset pressmen, photographers, dispatchers, and many others.

To be qualified in one of the positions above requires from

four months active duty training to 12 months. A difficult skill, such as translating Oriental languages, can require as much as 18 months active duty training under the new program. This contrasts with the former requirement of six months active duty for everyone, regardless of his Army job.

THE LONGER periods of active duty training time are required mainly in the linguistic, electronic, and mechanical maintenance fields, Major Hig-

gins said. He explained that the longer periods of active duty will give the Army time to train Reservists in needed skills which cannot be acquired in six months. At the same time, the Reservist will gain valuable knowledge which will be useful in competing for promotion for better paying civilian jobs.

serve unit. Previously, enlistees between 17 and 18½ were required to serve eight years.

NORMALLY, the new Reservist will be expected to report for active duty within 120 days of his enlistment. The reporting date for high school students can be delayed as much as a year.

Standard Forms Developed For Veteran Tax Exemptions

California veterans applying for their exemptions on property taxes in 1964 will use a standard form, reports Richard Nevins, Southern California member of the State Board of Equalization.

Nevins said the forms have been designed for interim use by the assessors in California's 58 counties. Last year, total veterans exemptions averaged \$908 each, while the actual dollar value was placed at \$881,209,000. More than 970,000 veterans received the exemptions.

The change to standard forms was prompted by numerous grand jury investigations into veterans exemption claims. The State Senate directed the Board of Equalization to design a standard form in 1963, and ordered a report to the legislature in 1965.

The interim forms will be issued in order to give some basis for a full report to the State Legislature.
