

# 'Miracle Worker' Opens Tomorrow

William Gibson's prize-winning play about the life of Helen Keller opens its Christmas run at El Camino College tonight. Curtain time for opening night is 8:30 p.m.

Presented by the theater arts department at El Camino, "The Miracle Worker" depicts the association between Miss Keller and her teacher, Ann Sullivan, who taught her to see with her hands.

Sandra Lowell will portray Miss Keller, while Gayle McClellan will play the difficult role of Ann.

OTHERS IN THE play include Nancy McCarthy as Kate Keller; Richard Centola, as Arthur Keller; Michael Hicks, as James Keller; Jane McCabe, as Aunt Ev; Ilsa Raumberger, as Martha, and Helen Thompson as Viney.

Burnett Ferguson will direct the production, which uses expressionistic sets and stylized acting techniques. The play was acclaimed by the critics of Broadway as representative of the Christmas spirit in its sim-

licity, timeliness, and concept.

A matinee is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. Sunday. Performances tonight, Friday, Saturday and Sunday evening begins at 8:30. Tickets are priced at \$1.50 for adults and 50 cents for children. Reserved seats may be obtained in the El Camino bookstore.

## Public Hearing On Lights Told

The Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing Dec. 19 in petition of Carson area residents to install six street lights on four streets in the area.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the hearing will be held at 9:30 a.m. in the Board Room to determine possible annexation of Tract 24941 to the Dolores Lighting District.

Approval of the petition would result in installation of six 4,000-lumen lights on new steel poles on Dolores Street and Ronan, Enola and Gulf Avenues.

Chace said plans also provide for six 4,000-lumen lights on existing poles along the south side of 228th Street between Main and Dolores Street in the existing lighting district.
