Services to Be Held for Dr. Fraser

Services for Dr. Wallace H. Fraser, long-time resident of the Southwest and member of the El Camino College Board of Trustees, will be held tomorrow at 11 a.m. at Tenth Avenue Baptist Church, 78th Place and Tenth Avenue, Inglewood. Mr. Fraser died Friday. He suffered a heart attack Nov. 30.

The Rev. Ernest L. Hastings, pastor of the church, will officiate, assisted by Dr. Hubert Davidson, long associated with the congregation. Private interment will follow at Inglewood Park Cemetery.

Born in 1909 in Morenci, Ariz., Dr. Fraser began his education at Hawthorne Elementary School, and continued in local schools until the second year of study at Inglewood High when he dropped out to compete as a lightweight in professional boxing.

Following an eight-year boxing career, Dr. Fraser returned to high school and continued through the University of Southern California to obtain a degree in dentistry.

Active in this field for the past 18 years in Hawthorne, after serving with the dental corps for three years during World War II, Dr. Fraser was known also as a community leader.

He held membership in the Hawthorne Rotary Club, Hawthorne Masonic Lodge, Long Beach Shrine and the Tenth Avenue Baptist Church.

In addition he held membership in a number of professional organizations, including the Western Dental Society, Los Angeles County Dental Society, American Dental Assn., Delta Sigma Delta dental fraternity and the Southern California State Dental Assn.

At the time of his death, Dr. Fraser was completing his 10th year as a member of the El Camino College board, which he served as vice president. He also served on the advisory board of the Bank of America and the Board of Trustees of the Hawthorne Elementary School District.

Survivors include his widow, Nina; son, Timothy of the family home at 321 W. 130th St., Hawthorne; daughter, Sally Jane Lutz of Hawthorne; two brothers, Sedgewick of La Jolla and Robert of Whittier; and sister, Alice Allen of Hawthorne.

The family has requested that in lieu of flowers, contributions be made to the Heart Fund of the Los Angeles County Heart Assn.
