## Jaycees Announce Seat Belt Clinic

In an effort to increase the number of seat belts now in use, the Torrance Junior Chamber of Commerce will sponsor another seat belt clinic Jan. 18 and 19.

The clinic will be held in the Bank of America parking lot, Hawthorne Avenue and Sepulveda Boulevard, from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. Belts may be purchased at \$5.95 each, in seven different colors, and will be installed free by members of the Jaycees.

Belts meet the standards set by the California Highway Patrol. All belts have metal-to-metal clasps. A number of studies have been made of accidents, and it has been proven they do save lives.

Both the Torrance Traffic Safety Council and the Torrance Police Department have endorsed the Jaycee Seat Belt Clinics. Many well known authorities on traffic safety report that loss of life can be sharply reduced by having, and using, seat belts.
