Cleon Skousen, lecturer and author of the best seller "The Naked Communist" will speak at South High School at 8 p.m. Friday on the subject, "Red Menace in South America."

The program is being sponsored by the Peninsula Forum. R. E. Merrill, president of the forum, invites all interested persons to attend the lecture.

Merrill also announced a lecture by foreign correspondent Hilarie DuBerrier, scheduled in November, will be given Jan. 31 at South High. The program was postponed because of the assassination of President Kennedy.

Skousen was born in Canada and attended schools in Canada, the United States, and Mexico. He received his degree from George Washington University. He served two years in the British Isles as a missionary for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Snow-Covered Mountain Due In City Park

If you can't go to the snow-covered mountains for skiing, the Torrance Recreation Department has arranged to bring the snow — and a little mountain — to Torrance for you.

La Romeria Park will have a snow ski area set up Jan. 29 for teenagers and adults as part of a three-lesson skiing program. The program will open next Wednesday with a ski film, lecture, and fashion show. The first lesson will be held at the Recreation Center, 3341 Torrance Blvd.

The second lesson will be given at La Romeria Park Jan. 22 on a dryland practice area. The three-lesson program will be climaxed by a lesson on a snow-covered ski area Jan. 29.

Cost of the three lessons is \$2 — the cost of the snow for the final thrill. Ski equipment, needed for the second and third lessons, may be rented at \$1 per lesson.

The program is intended for teenagers and adults, but children over seven may enroll if their parents are attending the lessons as well.

HE JOINED the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1935, and served as a special agent and later as an administrator at the FBI headquarters.

In 1951, he left the FBI to become a member of the faculty at Brigham Young University. In 1956, Skousen helped to reorganize the Salt Lake City Police Department and later became the chief of police, a post held until 1960.

In addition to "The Naked Communist," Skousen has also written "So You Want to Raise a Boy." He is the father of eight children and currently lives in Utah.

Board Okays Concession Stand Plans

In keeping with the do-it-yourself theme set by Board President Bert M. Lynn, the Board of Education accepted and approved plans for the West High School concession stand at its meeting Monday evening.

The plans, approved by the State Division of Architecture, were prepared by Roy Donley, AIA, project architect for West High School. Donley donated the plans and working drawings to the board.

The structure will be a 10 by 40 foot building of concrete blocks. The architecture is compatible with the design of West High School. Construction of the facility will begin about March 1, with Lynn leading a work crew including members of the board and a number of community citizens who have volunteered for the project.

Doctor Talks On Russian Experiences

Dr. William D. Moore of the Stanford University School of Medicine, will present an illustrated lecture, "A Stanford Doctor in Russia," at Marymount College Wednesday at 8 p.m. There will be no admission charge.

Dr. Moore who worked and lived for five months in the pathology department of the First Medical Institute, the foremost medical school in Russia, studied Russia's famed two-headed dog as well as observing laboratory techniques.

His illustrated lecture will cover daily life and customs in Russia today as well as current medical developments in the USSR.
