Precincts Established For Election

Voters in the special election of the Torrance Unified School District will cast their ballots in 39 election precincts. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. on Feb. 4.

More than 40,000 voters are eligible to vote in the special election to determine whether the general purposes tax rate will be increased to a maximum of \$3.30 per \$100 assessed valuation.

Some voters will find they do not vote at the school in their attendance area since the election precincts must follow boundaries of general election precincts.

Voters will receive a card giving them the correct polling place on or about Jan. 25. School officials suggest the card be taken to the polls.

Legal advertising describing the election precincts and listing polling places will appear in THE HERALD editions Jan. 16 and Jan. 23.

County Seeks 30 Appraiser Applications

County Assessor Phil Watson has announced that filing will begin tomorrow for trainee appraiser positions leading to permanent appraisal positions in the real estate division of his office.

Thirty openings are available for the one-year trainee course starting March 2. Applicants must be 21 years of age, and residents of Los Angeles County at time of appointment...

Upon completion of the trainee course, qualified appointees will be advanced to the position of appraiser, with a starting salary of \$608 per month.

Construction Of \$600,000 Facility Set

Construction of the new \$600,000 manufacturing and distribution plant for Premiere Aluminum Products, Inc., near the Harbor Freeway and 182nd Street is expected to get under way this month.

of the Bands, 155 W. Washington Blvd., Los Angeles 15, according to Warren M. Dorn, chairman of the Board of Supervisors.


This fifth annual teenage musical affair, which spotlights
