

## Panel Explains Schools Guidance Program Here

Robert Dollarhide, guidance counselor for the Torrance schools, told members of the Torrance Education Advisory Committee this week that counseling is an integral part of the educational program.

Dollarhide chaired a program on the counseling program in the schools at the Monday luncheon meeting of TEAC. With him were Mrs. Helen An-

person, school psychologist; Howard Cole, a West High counselor; and Mrs. Lillian Dean, a South High counselor.

The panel described the purpose of the counseling and guidance program, and called it an intangible service. "You can, however, see the results," said Dollarhide.

## Principals Hear Board Chairman

Bert M. Lynn, president of the Torrance Board of Education, told members of the Torrance Elementary School Principals Assn. the present board's insistence on a "grass-roots approach to school policy" has resulted in effective community support for the Torrance schools.

Lynn spoke to the school principals on the subject, "Board and Administrative Relationships," at the regular monthly meeting of the group Friday.

THE BOARD president cited numerous changes that have been made by the present board, including elementary school grades, departmentalization of the seventh and eighth grades, and effective vocational programs. He told the group their ability to serve as effective leaders for their instructional staffs and as school administrators, has been a strong asset for the Torrance schools.

Richard Welte, principal of Calle Mayor School and president of the local association, said plans for inviting such speakers as Dr. Max Rafferty, state superintendent of public education, are now being made. Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of the Torrance schools, will be invited to speak to the group as well.

Officers of the newly-formed principals group include Robert Allen, vice president; Don Credell, secretary; and John McGee, treasurer. William Forrest is program chairman.
