In his early twenties, he was a winner in a four state vocal contest sponsored by a Denver radio station. He received a trip to Hollywood, where he immediately received offers for appearances on radio, television and motion pictures.

Not long ago, he left a successful career and decided to devote his life to sacred songs, reaching his audience with a new song of faith. His new World Record album entitled "How Big Is God?" is acclaimed one of the finest ever produced. The Ralph Carmichael orchestra and chorus provide the background.
