

College Opens Spring Semester on Feb. 3

New courses, plans for additional buildings, a full extension division schedule, special classes for children and a growing community participation program will serve to open the spring '64 semester on Monday, Feb. 3, at Marymount College.

Gradually the face of the 47-acre cliffside campus is being transformed into the 10-year plan visualized by the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, when the present five major structures will grow to 13, representing an investment in education of over \$10 million.

MARYMOUNT College is now completing its fourth academic year on the Palos Verdes Estates campus, following its move from the Sunset Boulevard location in west Los Angeles where it was headquartered for the past several decades. A steadily growing student body necessitated the building of the new facility.

The international aspect of Marymount is accentuated with a wide range of courses in the languages, history, art, music, philosophy, literature and theology. Students from the Orient, Europe and South America add to the world-wide flavor of the campus.

ARCHITECTS are completing sketches for the Fine Arts Center on the lower level, with the complex to include a permanent auditorium, art gallery and classrooms, and a new street will permit access directly from Palos Verdes Drive which fronts the campus.

The auditorium and gallery will be available for community functions, and next to be constructed will be a chapel which will enclose the quadrangle on the upper campus.

Dr. ROGER WAGNER, head of the Marymount College music department, will again conduct his popular Singers' Workshop, as well as a class in Music Criticism. Sven Reher, prominent violinist, will head the Contemporary Music class and

the Chamber Music Orchestra. In the language division, courses will cover Russian, Spanish, French and Italian. Theatre Arts classes will encompass a full range from beginning acting to a Directors' Lab, and a similar range is offered in both the history and literature sections.

Other classes include sculpture, interior design, art for elementary schools, English for foreign students, and an advanced group in camera portraiture, color photography and pictorial reporting.

MARYMOUNT College in Palos Verdes Estates is one of five institutions of higher learning conducted by the R.S.H.M. in the United States. Others are situated in Tarrytown, N. Y.; Arlington, Virginia; New York City and Boca Raton, Florida. Among others are schools in Rome, London, Paris and Barcelona.

Marymount was the first college to institute the junior year of study abroad in 1923 through a plan devised by the late Mother Butler in Tarrytown. The idea has since been widely adopted by American colleges and universities.

IN ADDITION to a generous social program, there are numerous extracurricular activities including lectures, musical events, art and library functions co-planned with community committees, clubs, publications and off-campus attendance at cultural and civic events.

Some 50 courses are listed for the spring semester of the extension division, which runs from Feb. 3 to May 22, and is coeducational. Full college credit is offered, with each student limited to six units of study except with special permission.

Mother M. du Sacre Coeur is president of Marymount College and Mother Gregory serves as dean. Marymount's enrollment currently is 400, with a campus planned for a top student population of approximately 750.
