Until Election

Trustees Shelve Initiative Drive

Efforts of the Torrance Board of Education to garner support for an initiative constitutional amendment on school financing have been shelved by the trustees until after the Feb. 4 over-ride election.

The trustees agreed to hold off further work on the amendment until after the election, so as not to confuse the issues in the forthcoming election.

An amendment which would force the state legislature to provide at least 50 per cent of the expenses of operating local districts was prepared for the board by the county counsel. Another provision of the amendment would require the

legislature to provide funds for any future mandated programs in local districts.

Board President Bert M. Lynn read a letter to the board Monday evening in which the Oakland Unified School District and the San Juan Unified School District expressed support for the Torrance proposals.

The local board, disturbed at the apparent lack of concern at the December conference of the California School Boards Assn., initiated a campaign on a board-to-board basis to put the school financing amendment before the state's voters. Thus far, says Lynn, support for the

Board Delays Action On Club Policy Again

Action on a school club policy by the Torrance Board of Education was delayed Monday evening for the second time in as many meetings.

Trustees are delaying action at the request of board member Dr. Kurt Shery, who contends the policy, if passed, would deny Key Club International from on-campus status in the school district. Key Clubs have not had on-campus status in the local high schools, and Shery wants the policy changed.

Eugene Cattermoll, a teacher and Key Club advisor at Gardena High School, told the board what the Key Clubs are doing and explained the purpose of the organization as an

on-campus club. Cattermoll said Key Clubs operate under the rules and guidance of the school.

DR. J. H. HULL, superintendent of schools, contends Key Clubs should remain off campus because of the possibility of conflict between the parent sponsoring Kiwanis International and the school district. Key Clubs are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club and are generally described as high school service clubs.

Shery argues the Kiwanis only "give advice and moral support" for the high school groups and operate within the policy guide lines of school districts.


